Hello Smith Families, Community, and Staff,

With the recent tragic event in Parkland, Florida, we are once again reminded of the value of community coming together to deal with the personal emotions, concerns, and questions such tragedies raise. We are also reminded of the impact that action as a community can play in preventing future tragedies.



We appreciate that within the Smith community there are varying beliefs on what the "right" course of action is to prevent tragedies like this one, and that the decision of which action to take is a personal one. We also believe and respect that it's a family decision to determine the level of exposure and discussion you have with your kids about events in the news and your own family values.

One thing we are confident in is that we, as a Smith community, value kindness.

In line with our <u>Mission Statement</u> as an organization, the Smith PTSA Board of Directors has voted to join several other PTSAs and community groups to participate in and spread the word about "Wear Blue for Kindness" day on March 14th, 2018. We invite you to join us.

This idea was started by the McAuliffe Elementary PTSA, and we as a board feel this is an age-appropriate, universal way that we can take immediate action to raise awareness, encourage family conversations, and strengthen connections in our community. We also feel this gives an outlet for families that want to "do something" but may not want to participate in the National Walkout events that are also planned for that day.

We have discussed with Principal Warner that the "Wear Blue for Kindness" complements the actions she and the rest of the staff at Smith are taking in the "Kindness Campaign" they are kicking off at school, and gives students and staff an opportunity to express their commitment to kindness by choosing to wear blue.

Wear Blue for Kindness Day Details

Who: Parents, Students, Teachers, Staff, and Community Members

What: Wear BLUE (color of peace), perform random acts of kindness, look out for those who are lonely, reach out to make new friends, and discuss as a family how kindness makes a difference

When: March 14th, 2018

Where: Anywhere you are that day

Why: Support the power of kindness, and make a statement that we are a community that is committed to creating a safe, welcoming, and supportive environment in our schools

Other Events, Resources, and Opportunities we want to make sure you are aware of:

- Also on March 14th, from 10:00am-10:17am there is a "National Walkout" planned at schools across the nation
 - As a private citizen, one of the Smith concerned parents has registered Smith as a site that parents (who may also choose to sign their kids out of school to participate) and community

- members may gather (off school grounds) for 17 minutes in remembrance of the 17 people who lost their lives at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida.
- Organizers of this event have selected the color ORANGE as the color to wear to support this this movement
- o This event is not endorsed by the Smith PTSA, however we want you to have access to the details should you choose to participate, and so you can discuss as you feel appropriate with your child as there may be a visible "orange" presence and they may have classmates pulled out of the classroom by parents to participate
